



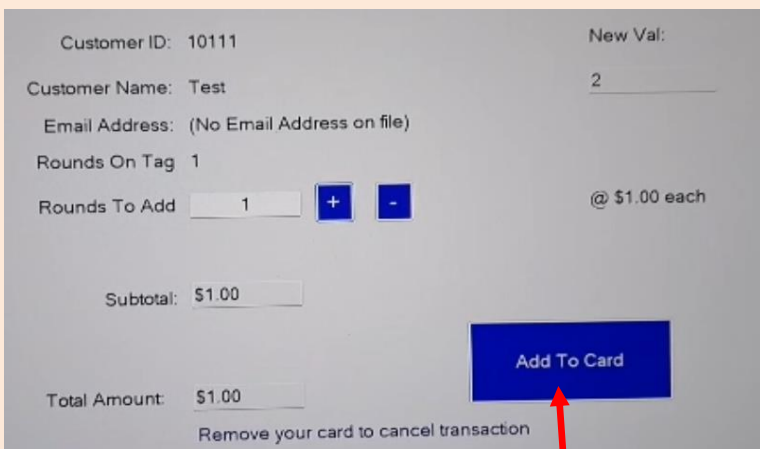
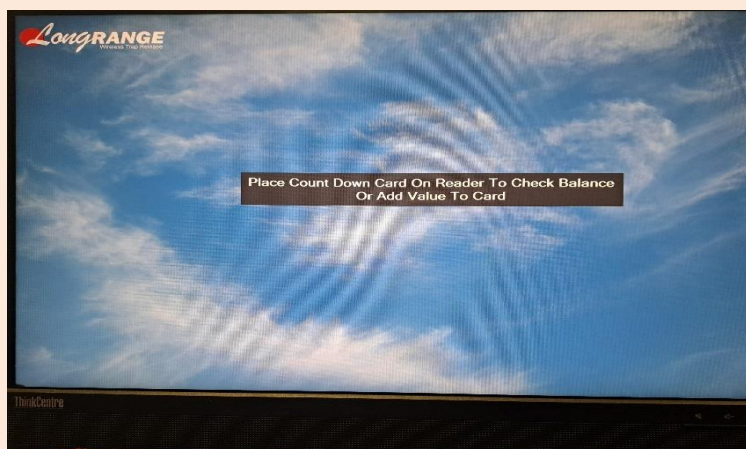
## ISC has introduced a new Target Card system for the Trap, Skeet and 5 Stand disciplines.

The system includes a Kiosk ( located in the Trap building), and Target Card Readers at each field on the hill, see below. Only Credit cards and Debit cards will be accepted to pay for the rounds.

**NO CASH!**



The Kiosk is used to load your Target Card with rounds that will be loaded into the Target Card Reader before shooting each round. **If the screen is Dark, touch screen to wake it up. See video on how to load and pay for rounds.**



A maximum of 28 rounds (700,) clays can only be loaded on the card. If you go over the limit, the "Add To Card" button is **deactivated**.

Each member that wants to shoot on the hill will require a Target Card that will be issued by a Range Officer on duty, the one-time fee for the card is \$10.00 dollars, replacement cost is also \$10. (**Range Officers will be trained**). Members may then purchase rounds and load them onto their Target Card at any time. The current cost of each round is \$7.00. The \$20 Guest fee will be paid on the Kiosk. Guest rounds will be added to the members' Target Card.

You can check the remaining rounds on your Target Card by simply inserting it into any Target Card Reader. The remaining rounds will be displayed as Tag=xxx.

Once all the shooters are ready to shoot a round, they must load the Target Card Readers with one round each before starting. Insert your Target Card in the Target Card Reader and push the Yellow button once. It will transfer 25 clays from your Target Card into the Target Card Reader. 25 clays will be deducted from your Target Card!

The shooter can only load 25 clays at a time. Pushing the Yellow button several times will not load anymore rounds. If you want to load another round for a guest, remove your card and reinsert it again and push the button to load another 25 clays.

When the shooter loads one round of 25 into the Target Card Reader at the Trap or Skeet field, it will display 27. Two clays per shooter are added for breakage. 3 extra clays are added on the 5 Stand. This may be adjusted by the club without notice. Once the round is over the Target Card Reader will reset all remaining rounds to Zero after 10 minutes of inactivity on the controller.

If during the round a stoppage of more than 10 minutes occurred the clay count will be reset to Zero. The Range Officer will have to load in extra rounds in order to complete that round of shooting.

The implementation of this new system aims to streamline the payment process, providing convenience and reducing cash handling for both members and Range Officers. It also ensures that all transactions are accurately recorded, enhancing transparency and accountability.

Members are encouraged to familiarize themselves with the Kiosk and Target Card Reader operations to ensure smooth and uninterrupted shooting sessions. Detailed instructions and assistance are available from Range Officers, myself and Connie, who are readily available to help with any issues that may arise. Additionally, members can refer to the links provided for comprehensive guidance and our website on the use of the Target Card Reader system.

By adopting this modern payment method, ISC continues to enhance the shooting experience, combining tradition with innovation to meet the evolving needs of the ISC community.

## Loading 5 Stand Controller

To load the 5 Stand Controller, insert your Target Card in the clip located on the back of the controller and click on Enter to load one round. Same procedure for the other shooters.



### Steps to follow:

1. Pick up your Target Card from R/O on duty.
2. Pay \$10 fee for your Target Card, and \$20 per Guest.
3. Load your Target Card with rounds of clay.
4. Proceed to Target Card Reader on the field of choice.
5. Insert your Target Card into the Target Card Reader and load 25 clays for yourself. Reinsert your Target Card to load 25 clays for your guest.
6. Proceed to shooting position and start on R/O's instructions.
